# What to expect

The RAF Museum London consists of six hangars, each with a range of aircraft, vehicles, equipment and people stories.

Due to the number of aircraft and engines in the hangars, you will notice the smell of oil as you go around the Museum.

There is a mainline railway which passes behind the Museum and passing trains can be heard from all hangars except H1.



























Most of the toilets (except those in H2) have hand dryers.

The Museum is busiest on weekends and during school holidays. If you are looking for a quieter time to visit, we would recommend after 2.00pm on weekdays during term time and after 3.00pm on weekends and school holidays.



Please note that the map shows only some of the aircraft as a guide to help you find your way. Occasionally, aircraft may be moved to allow work to happen.






# Hangar 1




The video and audio here **1** is activated by people walking past and can seem a little sudden.

# Hangars 3,4




The floor in H3,4,5 is painted concrete and is quite reflective which adds to the brightness of the hangars.

School groups and families often use the lunch space around lunch time and it can be very busy and noisy at that time.

Upstairs in H3 is a small exhibition space and the Art Gallery. Both of these areas have lower light levels.


# Hangar 5



There is a large door **1** shown at the top of the map which may sometimes be open for moving large objects in and out of the building.

**Light levels are lower under the wings of large planes.**
