Before your visit

Before you bring your class to the RAF Museum, you may want to prepare your pupils by using some of these activity/discussion ideas.

- What is a museum? Has anyone been to one before?
- Why are we visiting the RAF Museum?

During your visit

- Explore the Museum and encourage children to find examples of different types of transport, particularly aircraft
- In Hangar 1, there are small models of aircraft which children can get in – what adventure might they go on?
- In nice weather, go to our outdoor playground
- Enjoy your 'Teddy's Travels' workshop (check your booking confirmation for the session time)

After your visit

- Make up a story about Teddy and record it for others to listen to
- Set up the small world play to include some of the different types of transport which children saw during their visit
- Read stories about transport and journeys
- Create a display showing the different types of transport where Teddy's friends were found – his friends could be hidden in the pictures for children to find
- Create a transport museum in the classroom which can have caption labels, tour guides, maybe even a café and shop.
