## How do I pay in my fundraising money?

An online fundraising page is the easiest way to collect money whilst fundraising, this will be paid directly to the Museum. However, we know that some people will have cash collections so you can either add it to your fundraising page, or send us a cheque. ## Will the Museum cover my entry fee for a running event?

## How do I fundraise for my birthday, wedding or other celebration?

## If I'm under 16 can I fundraise for the RAF Museum?

If you're under 16, you'll need to get your parent or guardian's consent to fundraise.

### **Where will the money go that I fundraise?**

As a charity, we rely on the kindness and generosity of people like you to support the Museum. With the funds you raise, we can open our doors for free and share extraordinary stories to thousands of people each year. Here are some examples of how the money you fundraise can help:

£5.50 could pay for refreshments for older people attending an AgeUK session at the Museum

£13 could pay for a dress-length Tyvek bag to protect a garment from damage

£75 would pay for a class to learn more about the Second World War in our Battle of Britain workshop

£250 would pay for a tool storage cabinet for our engineering apprentices to use in our conservation centre.

£700 would pay for 26 heavy duty pallets for storage of the National Collection

£1059 would pay for a mobility scooter to support a visitor's journey around our sites
