



Flags are used to show identity. Every country has a flag - here in the UK, we have the Union Jack! The RAF Museum Midlands has the only Boulton Paul Defiant in the world - a night fighter aircraft that was flown during the Second World War - typically by Polish Squadrons. To mark their identity, a small Polish flag would be painted on near the cockpit.

Pride Flag



A flag can also be a symbol of community, celebration and pride! The Pride Flag is a special symbol of the LGBTQ+ community.

It is easily recognised as it is made up of the colours of the rainbow. Each colour represents something different.



Red: life
Orange: healing
Yellow: sunlight
Green: nature
Blue: serenity
Purple: spirit
