

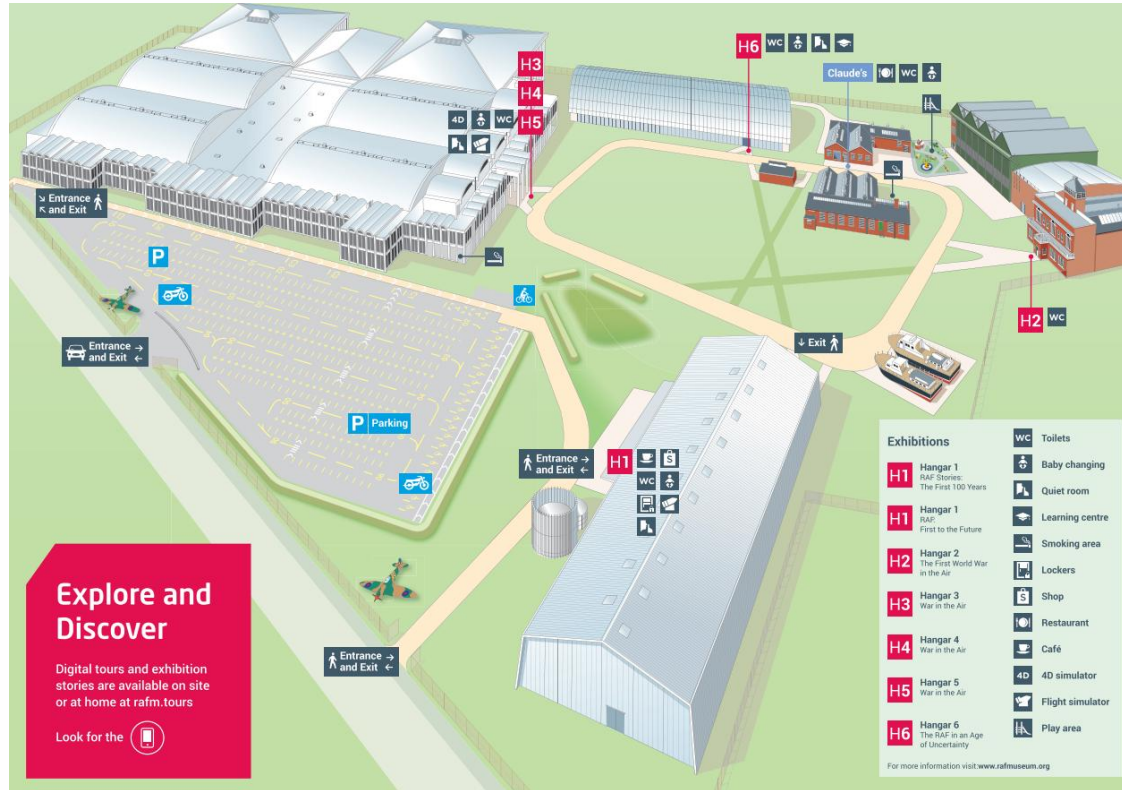


Welcome to the

If I am having a workshop, I might go to a classroom.



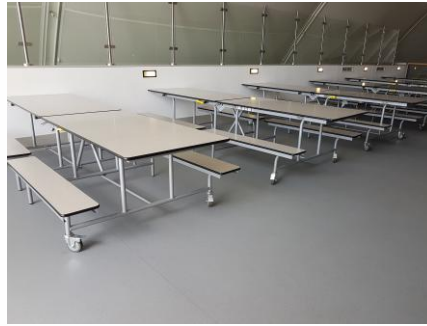
I can find the toilets by looking for these signs.
